EFTA countries much more prosperous than either the Eurozone or the UK

The EFTA countries - Switzerland, Norway & Iceland - remain outside the EU. They are far more prosperous than EU-27 as a whole, or the Eurozone, or the UK.

- On average, the member-countries of EFTA (the European Free Trade Association, comprising Switzerland, Norway & Iceland, which remain outside the EU) are twice as prosperous (measured by GDP per Capita) as those of EU-27 *Tables 1 & 2*
- On average, the EFTA countries are 73 per cent more prosperous than those of the EU's Eurozone *Tables 1 & 2*
- The UK is the eighth most prosperous EU country. On average, EFTA countries are 50 per cent more prosperous than the UK *Tables 1 & 2*
- The UK, with 16 per cent of EU-27 GDP & 12 per cent of EU-27 population, has only 8 per cent of the votes in the Council of Ministers, the main decision-making body of the EU *Table 1*
- The “Big Four” EU countries, Germany, the UK, France & Italy, together account for 65 per cent of EU-27 GDP & 54 per cent of EU-27 population *Table 1*
- The “Big Eight” EU countries (the “Big Four” plus Spain, the Netherlands, Belgium & Sweden), together account for 84 per cent of EU-27 GDP & 70 per cent of EU-27 population *Table 1*
- The most prosperous countries in the EU are Luxembourg, Ireland, Denmark & Sweden *Table 1*
- The least prosperous countries in the EU are Bulgaria, Romania, Latvia & the Slovak Republic *Table 1*
